Virtual Buildings and Grounds Subcommittee Report Thursday, November 14, 2024 at 5:30 p.m. Broadcast from the Media Studio 454 Broadway, Cambridge, MA

Called the purpose of for the purpose of presenting our new Interim Chief Operating Officer to the community, and sharing an update on the long-range Facilities Condition Assessment and summer capital projects.

Chair Rojas started the meeting at 5:35 p.m. and read the call of the meeting. The Executive Secretary conducted a roll call of subcommittee members present: Member Rojas, PRESENT; Member Rachel, PRESENT; Member Hudson-ABSENT.

Member Hudson joined the discussion at 6:00 p.m.

Chair Rojas highlighted the agreements of the meeting (below):

- Speak and listen from the heart (respect)
- Step up/step back (watch air time)
- Expect and accept non-closure (work in progress)
- Bike rack (list of things that are important but should be addressed another time)
- Public comment would be limited to 3 minutes to allow for a broader discussion.

Chair Rojas led round-robin introductions and asked attendees to share their Thanksgiving traditions.

Chair Rojas turned the meeting over to Interim COO Smith who gave brief introductory remarks sharing that he is new to the COO role, but has a long history with the district and is a Cambridge resident. Mr. Smith shared the following <u>slides</u>.

An overview of the presentation included:

- Facilities Condition Assessment with an example of the Peabody School
- Summer 2025 Capital Improvement Projects
- Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) School Survey Assessment Process

During the presentation, Interim COO Smith shared the following highlights:

- The work of his team directly relates to the District's objective of "Building Welcoming & Supportive Schools & District"
- The long term Facilities Condition Assessment (FCA) includes a 1.) building by building analysis;
 2.) a comprehensive assessment of the small and medium-sized projects and 3.) potential scenarios for CPS and the City of Cambridge to consider with respect to future major building or renovation projects.

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Ranking of CPS buildings in need of updating/repairs.

Mr. Smith turned the meeting over to Mr. Konjic who shared a detailed example of the Facility Assessment and Capacity Summary for the Peabody School which included a facilities condition assessment, educational adequacy index, sustainability index and recommended limited interventions.

Mr. Konjic paused for discussion. Topics included:

- Concerns about the increase in flooding issues and the district's commitment to partnering with the City to address these issues.
- Energy efficiency studies and proposed alternatives
- The importance of having an energy efficient building before installing energy efficient equipment
- The importance of creating breakout spaces to enhance learning opportunities.

Mr. Konjic continued the discussion and updated the group on the following projects:

- Longfellow Broadway Roof Replacement & Asbestos Abatement
- Longfellow Broadway and FMA Ventilator Replacements
- · Cambridgeport and FMA Elevator Upgrades
- Cambridgeport Boiler Replacements
- Solomon Building Waterproofing
- Baldwin Electrical Vault Beam replacement
- FMA Façade repairs
- Kennedy Longfellow Heater replacement
- Amigos School Gym Floor replacement
- Hagerty Plaza Waterproofing

Mr. Smith highlighted that he would continue to keep the group updated on the ongoing projects and that he looks forward to sharing the full report of the Facilities Condition Assessment.
