- 1. Cambridge <u>Public Schools</u> will eontinue to admit children for preschool who are 4 3 years by <u>April 1st and and 5 months and 4 years</u> at the start of school in September.
- 2. Cambridge Public Schools will admit children for kindergarten who are 5 years old by August 31st prior to the September that the student enters kindergarten.
- 2.3. Cambridge <u>Public Schools</u> will admit children for first grade who are 6 years old by implement a change in the entrance age for first grade to six years old by August 31st prior to the September that the student enters grade one.
- 34. The Cambridge Public Schools will pilot implement a separate pre-kindergarten program that is "research based" and provides language rich language educational experiences for children who are at least 4 years and 5 months old by the September they enter school entering preschool and kindergarten who meet the above criteria. In schools implementing this pilot, children would not repeat kindergarten. They would spend a year in the Pre-K room if they were under five years old at the start of school and then proceed to Kindergarten the next fall. Students who are enrolled in schools not implementing the Pilot Pre-K Program will be provided the eurrent Junior Kindergarten program in their Kindergarten classroom.
- 45. The Cambridge Public Schools, in collaboration with our families and community, will work to ensure that all children will be given opportunities to participate in quality early childhood programs. Will provide opportunities to choose to attend a high quality preschool program within the Cambridge Public Schools as part of the Universal Preschool mixed delivery preschool model for the City of Cambridge.
- 5. Teachers of current pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, and grade 1 classes will be given professional development opportunities in implementing best practices in early childhood education.
- 6. The Cambridge Public Schools will move toward <u>and maintain</u> National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) accreditation in all <u>of JK Preschool</u> and Kindergarten programs.
- 7. The Cambridge Department of Early Elementary Education in collaboration with CPS The Zero to Eight Council (formerly the Early Childhood Advisory Council) will continue to study

the issues of accessibility to and quality of preschoolpre-school programs for all of Cambridge's three and four year olds.
