SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION: FISHTANK LEARNING (6-8 CURRICULUM)

<u>Purpose:</u> Beginning in September 2023, 6th -8th grade ELA educators will adopt the Fishtank Learning Curriculum, with ongoing professional learning to support effective planning and aligned implementation across schools.

Amount of Contract: \$31,500.00

Summary Description / Scope of Services:

- Ongoing professional development sessions for core-content teachers, coaches and interventionists, including SEI and special education teachers.
- Curriculum licenses (online teacher access to curriculum, PD modules and supplemental resources)

Additional Information:

Fishtank will provide a well-designed, rigorous and engaging literacy curriculum that empowers students to be critical and creative readers, writers, thinkers and individuals. The curriculum was selected through a robust curriculum review process that used the EdReports Criteria and the Culturally Responsive Curriculum Scorecard, along with research-based recommendations and educator values. ELA department staff, along with upper school ELA educators and coaches participated in this review.

Professional Learning Overview:

 Fishtank workshops are designed to provide teachers with the skills and knowledge to implement the Fishtank curriculum and adapt materials as necessary for their unique classrooms. Instructional preparation and decision making within these sessions supports educators in delivering a more rigorous, equitable and antiracist learning experience for all students.

Grade Level Curriculum Overview:

- In 6th grade, students explore the topic of "Coming of Age." Texts feature protagonists from diverse backgrounds, places and time periods, all of whom face challenges as they struggle to define their identities and claim their place in the world. Students consider how historically significant and everyday events in a young person's life can influence the person they become.
- In 7th grade, students explore the question: "What does it mean to be American?" Texts address diverse aspects of the American experience, including those of indigenous Americans, African Americans, first- and second-generation immigrants from different time periods and countries of origin, undocumented and LGBTQ+ youth. Students think deeply about the complex past, present, and future of America, and how to define their ever-changing identity as a nation.
- In 8th grade, students explore a timeless question: "Are human beings fundamentally good or evil?" Through classic and contemporary texts, students consider how access to power influences human behavior, and how everyday people respond in the face of unjust leadership, violent oppression, and cruelty. Students grapple with dark events from the past and contemplate their power as young people to create a better future.

NOTE: This contract does not represent the full cost of implementation. The related novels and texts for this curriculum will be purchased separately from the specific publishers. The estimated cost of these novels is \$71,000.
