The CitySprouts program builds schools' capacity to integrate school gardens as an instructional resource for teachers, an effective and engaging means for food and health education for students, and a unifying center to strengthen school communities and family involvement. City Sprouts serves all Cambridge Public School (CPS) elementary and upper school students (pre-K through 8th grade).
