Description:

The FY 2021 projected budget for the Food and Nutrition FY21 is \$3,952,993. The budget is supported through revenue is generated throughout the year from school breakfast and lunch programs, including Federal and State reimbursements and receipts from paid meals, and through a reimbursement from the City and a CPS general fund subsidy. To support improved engagement with Cambridge families, management of department promotions, and monitoring and evaluation of department communications, the FY 2021 Budget added a 1.0 FTE nutrition communications and engagement specialist to be paid from the Food Services Revolving Fund.

This recommendation: At the beginning of each year, to enable the department to conduct business seamlessly from the start of the year, a recommendation is put forth to the School Committee to initially appropriate the anticipated Federal and State revenues. This initial recommended appropriation is based on 80% of the Federal and State revenues received in FY20.

SUPPORTING DATA: RULES OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE: Chapter III, Section 19, <u>Acceptance of Grants for Expenditure</u>.
