Description/Scope of Services:

Providing scholarships high quality, full day out-of-school time (OST) programs and summer camps.

The identification and selection of summer programs was based on the following criteria:

- Programs needed to be offering full-day, in-person, Massachusetts state-licensed programming and services for students aged 4.5-13 years-old (grades K-7).
- High-quality, mission-driven organizations providing services in Cambridge
- Established track record of collaborating with CPS to support high needs students and families through strategies that support more equitable access to programs and services.
- Commit to reserving slots for high needs CPS students.
- Commit to accepting referrals from CPS and the Cambridge Agenda for Children Out-of-School
 Time (AFCOST) to fill those slots, while prioritizing a continuum of out-of-school time care from
 school year to summer when possible.
- Accept CPS scholarships based on a set and agreed upon maximum daily rate, \$70/day, which
 is comparable to what state-licensed providers in Cambridge charge for summer programming.
- Accept that reimbursements for tuition costs to scholarshipped CPS students would be paid in arrears, not at the beginning of the summer, as is typically the case.
- A commitment to work with CPS to coordinate appropriate data sharing about students' learning and growth needs, and possible use of CPS's personalized learning tools available for use during the summer.
- Providers must submit two invoices one for services through July 31st and one for services during the month August.
