**File: IHBF – HOME OR HOSPITAL EDUCATIONAL SERVICES BOUND INSTRUCTION**

The Cambridge Public Schools offers home ~~or hospital~~bound instruction educational services to students who are unable to attend classes because of ~~medical reasons~~prolonged illness. ~~Homebound instruction is furnished to those students who are unable to attend classes for at least four consecutive weeks due to a physical injury, medical situation, or a severe emotional problem.~~ These educational services instruction is are designed to provide maintenance in the basic academic courses so that when a student returns to school they will not be at a disadvantage and will be provided ~~Upon receipt of a physician's written order verifying the student enrolled in a public school or placed by a public school in a private setting must remain at home or in a hospital on a day or overnight basis, or any combination of both, for medical reasons and for a period of not less than fourteen school days in any school year, the school shall arrange for the provision of~~ homebound educational services in the home or hospital instruction.

Such services shall be provided with sufficient frequency to allow the student to continue their educational program, as long as such services do not interfere with the medical needs of the student. The principal shall coordinate such services with the Administrator of Special Education for eligible students. Such educational services shall not be considered special education unless the student has been determined eligible for such services, and the services include services on the student's IEP.
