SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION: Savvas Learning Company

Purpose: To purchase new textbooks for the CRLS Biology courses.

Amount of Contract: \$28,158.55

Description/Scope of Services: The CRLS Biology teaching team has reviewed the most current Miller & Levine and McGraw Hill science textbooks and curriculum platforms, and they are recommending Miller & Levin *Biology* (edition 2019). Currently, a 2010 edition of the textbook is being used.

Miller & Levine has been the choice of the CRLS Biology team for over twenty years, and transitioning to the newest edition should be smooth. Excitingly, the 2019 edition offers online access, which merges seamlessly with Google Classroom, a tool utilized by all the teaching staff. Online access also ensures that updates to the curriculum are accessible to learners without the purchase of additional textbooks. Students will be able to access the textbook in the traditional hard cover option and via their Chromebooks in the online format. The combination of the online tools and CRLS's 1:1 Chromebook learning platform will most certainly increase equity and accessibility to the Biology curriculum. For example in the older series separate texts were published for ELL and special education populations. With the 2019 online features, modified text and exercises are fully available through the one title/text.

A set of 300 textbooks will be purchased so each student enrolled in a Biology course will have a physical copy as well as access to the online platform.
