Part I: MCAS \& Review of data within the school

Notes:

- We will focus on Math
- We want to acknowledge that MCAS is not unbiased, DESE is looking at questions and trying to improve them
- Despite that, in order to close gaps, we must consider what we can learn from this assessment
- In planning for this presentation, we looked at the performance of our students who are black and low-income, because these are the groups highlighted in entry interviews as groups we are not meeting the needs of at G\&P.
- We reviewed the "Ladder of Inference" and the importance of staying low on the ladder while looking at data - meaning not jumping to conclusions, instead asking yourself - what do you notice, what do you see?
- MCAS is a statewide assessment administered to students in grades 3-8 and 10.
- It is a graduation requirement in Massachusetts.
- [Slides were shared to show the performance of students meeting or exceeding expectations in Math]
- In 2022, 60\% of students met or exceeded expectations
- Subgroups: White (approx 75\%); Black (approx. 15\%); Multi-Race (approx. 70\%); Asian, (approx. 50\%) met or exceeded expectations
- Low-income students (approx 22\%) whereas Not Low-income (approx, 80\%)
- Other data was shared regarding the achievement percentiles by demographic groups
