- Review of Haggerty Families by geographic area (thank you Lissa for pulling and plotting this info!): Locations
 - We also looked at the data in terms of <u>neighborhoods</u>. In terms of neighborhoods, we see the majority of our families live in Strawberry Hill, (the neighborhood between Fresh Pond Parkway, Fresh Pond and Grove Street). The next biggest group of families live in North Cambridge, which includes Rindge Ave., CambridgePark Drive, and Concord Turnpike. The majority of the remaining families live in the Highlands, West Cambridge or Neighborhood Nine. Only a handful of families live East of Harvard Square.
- (SAC hosted) Family Game night/Focus group by neighborhood
 - "Math Festival" resources could we bring a math festival type event into a community, introduce the games and leave math games for families to play at home.
 - Game Exchange/Library creation of a free game exchange that students could sign out and bring home and then return.
