RAUC School Improvement Plan Discussion 8:10-8:35	 Discussion of <u>RAUC 2021-2024 School Improvement Plan (SIP)</u> Context: School Improvement Plans (SIPs) are developed every two years by each school team. They are in line with district-wide improvement objectives but identify the specific priority work and strategies for their school community. Skim the document silently and note any wonders and any areas that need clarification Clarification questions/comments SMART goals - says there would be a 10% increase in family satisfaction but where is it now? We've shifted tools for this so we don't have data on this now Idea is we'd do something in January or February and then something again in May; we have not gotten our baseline yet and district hasn't given info yet about any tools/surveys we expect to use

	• Listening conferences - what is the structure and how does this work?
	 Advisors have max 8 students and would make connections w/ families/students to meet for 15-20 minutes
	 What has participation been like? Based on data for how many advisors who reached out to Julia to try to schedule a conference and who we couldn't schedule a conference w/, >90% What's the expectation of amount of parent participation?
	 In the past, 3 reps; trying to aim for 4-5 if possible What's the status of student council members? Has been a challenge to even get student council to meet but would like student reps to join and would love ideas What about high school RAUC alum (could count towards community service hours)? Initiative 3: about schedule
	 How can we hear student voices about schedule? Is this a living document or after a consensus a reached, will it not be changed? YES - it is a living document

	 After reviewing documents: What questions do you still have about the equity self-assessment? Ideas for moving forward? Proposal: utilizing Listening Conferences to hear from all families Action research/Home visits/interview
	 Clarification questions Equity audit vs. equity self-assessment: district determined which schools would do an equity audit vs. self-assessment - what was the criteria for this? The idea seems to be normalize the audits and eventually move towards doing 1-2 audits a year RAUC is NOT doing be asked to do an equity audit (external review)

 What's in the school community passion/interest in doing the equity self-assessment? If we know this w/ some clarity, we can accomplish this regardless of what the district expectations are There seems to be a real passion to identifying equity challenges
Description of district training (Julie, Paula, Julia)
 Proposal Ask simple questions during listening conference Tension: only time we can hear from all families is this but families also have things they may want to share and questions they want to ask that aren't necessarily related to this
 Comments We have to have multiple ways of collecting information Let folks know ahead of time that one of the listening conferences would be focused on our equity self-assessment
 Parent interview w/ child worksheet/homework Incentive on child's end to make sure that happens What do we want to hear from families? After school programs and activities - could the clubs be another avenue to collect data in terms of how the kids engage? What are ways to make that equitable for
 What are ways to make that equilable for everyone? Struggle: we don't know what we don't know; there are things that we could just not be thinking about When we're thinking about questions, can we find two very well-thought out open-ended questions and maybe it will take more work and analyzing and can we use that info to feed into the survey and get valuable info
 If we're really looking for family feedback, could we have the kids interview the parents? It'd be a different dynamic than teachers interviewing parentsCould be an assignment Three things that Steve has seen that parents care about for equitable schools
 Child's capacity to and school's support their learning Child and their parents can see themselves and their culture in school staff and curriculum

	 School discipline is equitable and their child is not held to a higher or lower expectation than other kids Bo: In our affinity groups the question that always surfaces is "Does my child feel seen?" Echo that surveys are good for getting broad info but other tools like focus groups & bringing folks together in different formats to have more rich and free flowing info helps w/ getting richer data Summary People seem to be OK w/ some type of survey at listening conferences (that is not the only goal) AND we do other things
Wrap up with next steps	 Next mtg (January 4, 2022) Proposal: next mtg, we design the most simple, accessible questions that we could ask for survey February: spend mtg discussing kid/parent interviews and other action research Goal: by end of this school year, we gathered info at least 3 ways and have some data that can help shape the following year Tasks before next mtg
