Clarification questions

- Will we be able to keep any new staff that was hired?
 - Yes we only have 1 new staff member (due to the pandemic) building sub
 - The other new staff that were hired were through the district budget and were already being hired
- What's the timing of the budgets?
 - 2021-2022 SIP budget can't be made until the school committee approves the district budget
- When we publicize the budget, is there a way to include it in multiple languages or make it very easy to see translation?

How can we best communicate this information to families?

- If we are putting aside a lot of money in the budget for equity work (as in the SIP), we should highlight that
- We could start out with this (e.g. one eye-catching headline) and then mention other things

- Might be good to time this info when the budget gets approved (or when the budget meetings are) could be a way to support family involvement in the process (e.g. what are we excited about in this proposed budget)
- Make it clear to families how the budget will help them and what is available for their students

Open floor

- Tutoring and clubs have been very impactful for families based on listening conferences
 - Would be important to make this information very accessible to families (and to know about literacy interventionist)
- Small groups in general have been helpful
 - Wonder: is there a way to tap into remote learning opportunities and after the pandemic use SIP money to provide a stipend to interested staff to provide more one-on-one tutoring
